Duke of Edinburgh Bronze and Silver Award Information 2021

Despite current restrictions we are trying to put a plan in place which will enable our students to fully complete their Awards this year.

Students do need to complete all four sections, with Volunteering, Physical and Skills being individually organised.

Due to lockdown restrictions, we have extended the deadline for completion of these sections, but all three of them should have been started in order to take part in the Expedition training (apart from Silver who require longer).

With regards to the Expedition section, temporary changes have been put in place to encourage students to complete it. For example, students will not camp as part of the process, but return home to sleep then continue the following day.

Parents and carers will need to be available and flexible with regards to the Practice and Assessment expeditions, as students will need to be dropped off and collected from a variety of locations, and with rather unpredictable navigational skills, timings might not always be spot on! Students will need to be able to call you to be collected as required on the Friday night (approx. 8 pm), and then dropped back for the following morning (timings tbc).

The priority items need to be <u>walking boots/shoes</u>, walking socks as well as a decent <u>rucsac</u>. Despite not needing a tent and sleeping bag, students will be expected to carry the normal equipment as part of their expedition. Getting blisters can prevent a student from finishing their walk, so getting boots worn in over the next month or so is going to be important, and the importance of decent socks cannot be over-emphasised!

School will provide the cooking equipment (stove and pans), map cases and compass, but students will need the rest from the kit list which will include:

Sleeping bag
Tent (to share between the team)
Waterproof jacket and trousers
Cutlery and plate/mug
First aid kit
Torch
Roll mat (please check kit list).

With lunchtimes also reduced in time, we will need to do some <u>training after school each week up to Easter</u> so that the holiday can be spent improving walking fitness with added confidence in navigation skills. Therefore, we will be running **after school training from 3.15-5.30pm each Thursday** until Easter, starting next week on 18th March, then Thursday 25th, and, <u>if needed</u> the following Thursday 1st April (the last day of term).

Students will need a change of clothes, as we will be getting out and walking footpaths which may be muddy.

All students have access to an excellent mapping resource via the Expedition section of their e-account. It is important they become familiar with this, and a guide is linked below to help them use it:

eDofE Mapping User Guide incl. NI - DofE

This resource allows them to make route cards, calculate distances, grid references, timings as well as share maps electronically between the team.

Teams will be maximum of 7 in size, minimum of 5, and students need to let me know the names of their teams as soon as possible.

Please note that students must attend all training, including the Practice Expedition, in order to take part in the Assessment Expedition.
